





Reflections on Prerana, Mumbai

Visiting Prerana and meeting with the organization's leader Priti Patkar was truly an eye-opening experience. Priti is a trailblazer with immense empathy, passion, and fortitude. I had the opportunity to discuss Prerna's mission and programming. Priti explained the realities of sex workers in Mumbai's red-light district, the complex web of dangerous and rampant trafficking in India, and the lack of support networks for sex workers and their children. She explained that the women who seek assistance from Prerana want their children to have better lives, lives outside of the red-light district, lives free of stigma, and importantly, lives of dignity.

Prerana provides this through their relentless outreach, dedicated staff, and night care center. Their comprehensive services include mental health counseling, life-skills training, and education. No child from the program entered lives in the red-light district, and each was given an opportunity for a better future that they worked towards and achieved.

I sat in on an evening study class about hygiene that CHI helps to fund. Each child was completely engaged in learning and was able to recall information and specifics from prior lessons that connected to the one being taught. I was able to chat with them and witness their keenness to learn, to connect with other people, and their intelligence. I was so moved to see that each child in the center was receiving the support and help they would not otherwise get.

I am so glad that Children's Hope is funding Prerana's educational programming.

CHI launched a new Education Initiative to mark our 30 years of pioneering work in education. 30/30 Education Initiative brings together 30 years of work with our network of niche programs and partners, emphasizing CHI's multi-pronged Whole Child approach from Cradle to Career.



What is 30/30?

CHI pledged to have a 30-strong network of old and new partners on a proven path to children's success. Using our 30 years of experience in formal and non formal education this initiative addresses key components necessary to ensure school preparedness beginning with Early Childhood Education for 3 to 6 year-olds, concept learning in primary and middle school and prevent drop outs with special focus on the girl child.

Besides ensuring an empowering education, the 30/30 Education Initiative emphasizes elements essential for success:

- Digital learning: computer education, smart boards in class
- Career Counseling: career planning, exposure to professions, college prep
- Health and Nutrition: medical checkups, health milestones, nutrition
- Mental health: athletics, art, music, dance, yoga From Cradle to Career, CHI is there.

Ravi Kanth Ganti

is the Chief Operating Officer of CHI-Ekalavya Schools and the Team Lead for CHI 's 30/30 Education Initiative in India. He was a Non-Formal Education (NFE) expert for 'World Education' on a FAO-UN project.

What made you become an educator?

I started teaching when I was 17 as a part-time tutor. After completing my Masters in microbiology, I realized India did not have enough opportunities for biology graduates. I liked teaching, which helped me move to the only job opportunity available to me.

What do you like best about your job?

I get an opportunity to inspire and guide young students - the most important task if India wants to develop . This is what I love about my job.

What would you change?

I would love to change rote learning in a classroom. Children should focus on conceptual learning through projects, experiments, and discussion. Currently, 99% of the Indian schools are NOT doing this. I don't blame them since many schools lack the infrastructure and competent human resources to do this well.

What is your idea of an ideal school?

Excellent infrastructure, qualified & competent human resources, citizenship education, arts & music, experiential science facilities, and the ability to realize the innate capabilities of each child & steer them towards the livelihood that best suits them.
